Masonic Legend of the Forget-Me-Not Pin

In 1934, after Hitler went into power, it became apparent that Freemasonry was in danger. The German "Grand Lodge of the Sun" elected to wear a little blue flower in lieu of the traditional Square and Compass. It was felt that this symbol would not attract attention from the Nazis. Masonry went underground. Throughout the entire Nazi era, this flower marked a Brother.

In 1947, the "Grand Lodge of the Sun" was reopened, with the little Forget-Me-Not pin adopted as the emblem of that convention.

In 1948, the pin was adopted as an official Masonic emblem in honor of the thousands of valiant Brethren who carried on Masonic work under adverse conditions. This little pin has been known since then as the official emblem of Masonry and the pride it represents for their Fraternity.
