The call for assistance to help with replacing the second air conditioner in the Red Room has been well received by our members. So far, 77 members have donated \$5,660.00. To reach the needed funds of \$18,000.00 we need to raise an additional \$12,340.00. I believe we will raise necessary funds to complete our task if each of us helps by donating \$25.00; in this way we will avoid the daunting task of having to borrow the necessary remaining money.


